# PERSPECTIVE

## *Dear Members and Donors:*



As in 2003, the Zoo Society's 2004 net declined slightly due to a significant drop in one category: estate gifts. Every other category increased: membership dues, gift shop sales, corporate gifts and sponsorships, direct donations and special events. As a result, the Zoo Society's 2004 net of \$3,200,761 more than kept pace with Zoo funding requests. In all, the Zoo Society transferred \$2,740,894 in grants to the N.C. Zoo.

These grants enriched the lives of animals and advanced the cause of conservation around the world. Society grants supported art projects, innovative education programs, and important conservation research. They also made the zoo experience more meaningful and fun for visitors.

Yet it would not be unreasonable to say that our greatest successes in 2004 may be in the foundations laid for the future. We made great strides toward raising the \$6 million we will need for the *Watani Grasslands* project. This expansion of the African plains exhibits will make the N.C. Zoo a world leader in elephant and rhinoceros conservation, and will create an unequalled immersion experience for visitors.

Another important initiative, the Valerie H. Schindler Wildlife Learning Center, promises virtually limitless possibilities for the future of conservation education and research, and for expanding the Zoo's reach far beyond the Park itself.

All of this is made possible by the generosity of donors like you. Ultimately, members and donors are the N.C. Zoo Society, so the Zoo and Zoo Society want to thank all of our members, donors and friends for the trust and support they have given us in 2004. We promise to honor that trust and support with an unyielding commitment to responsible stewardship.

Together we have accomplished much, and together we will accomplish much more for the natural world that means so much to us all. 2004 was a great year. The best is yet to come.

# ZOOM IN

In 2004, the Zoo Society provided \$2,740,894 in direct support of the Zoo's animals, plants, education, recreation, conservation and research programs. Society funding also supported Zoo marketing, Zoo staff training and development, Zoo production of the award-winning television series *The Zoo FileZ*, Zoo management and maintenance of its Web site, and more.

## FOCUS ON:

### *Zoo Improvements and Expansions*

#### **Project: Pachyderms**

By the end of 2004, the Zoo Society had raised almost \$4 million of the \$6 million needed for the N.C. Zoo to create one of the finest elephant and rhinoceros facilities in the world. Called *Project: Pachyderms*, the campaign aims to raise funds to double the size of the Zoo's existing elephant exhibit and expand the Plains of Africa exhibit to more closely resemble a genuine African grassland. The new exhibit will be called *Watani Grasslands*. The project will eventually house 10 or more African elephants, 10 – 12 southern white rhinoceroses, and many species of antelope. Plans also include animal housing facilities, an immersion walkway and educational interpretives.

The Zoo Society's success so far in this campaign is due to the generosity of many members and friends. Tylee and Pat Wilson contributed \$75,000, and Mable and A.P. Anderson gave \$35,000. Other contributions include \$30,000 from the John Wesley and Anna Hodgin Hanes Foundation, \$15,000 from Ron and Cathy Butler, \$10,000 from the Sara Lee Corporation and \$7,500 from the F.M. Kirby Foundation.

These and many other donors will make it possible for the N.C. Zoo Society to help provide sufficient space for large and complex elephant and rhino families.

This exhibit complex will position the Zoo as a leader in breeding both of these species. Already, Zoo staff is demonstrating the skill this goal demands. In late 2004, N.C. Zoo Senior Veterinarian, Dr. Barbara

Wolfe, played a key role as part of a team that artificially inseminated Ivory, a 23-year-old female African Elephant living at the Indianapolis Zoo. Recent ultrasound tests confirm that Ivory is pregnant and is expected to give birth in September 2006.

#### **Valerie H. Schindler Wildlife Learning Center**

The Zoo Society is also building for the future by leading the drive to fund the Valerie H. Schindler Wildlife Learning Center, named in memory of the wife of Dr. Anton Schindler of Durham. Dr. Schindler began the campaign with a generous challenge grant in 2003. In 2004, Bob and Bonnie Meeker followed with a contribution of \$250,000. Also in 2004, The Hillsdale Fund, Inc., gave \$35,000 and The Cannon Foundation, Inc. gave \$25,000. So far, the Zoo Society has raised \$576,425 of the \$630,000 needed for the project.

The Valerie H. Schindler Wildlife Learning Center will promote academic learning, support scientific research and enhance artistic expression by providing space and facilities where scholars, students and artists can pursue their goals in an atmosphere of discovery and creative sharing. The center's research facilities, Internet access, housing and campsites will support long-term exploration through workshops, camping and hands-on research under the tutelage of the Zoo's professional staff. With as many as 75 college students and 100 teachers-in-training learning at the center every year, the Zoo's outreach will be almost boundless.



# FOCUS ON: *Reaching and Teaching*



## **Interactive Technology**

Thanks to a generous in-kind donation of expertise and materials from MindWorks Multimedia of Durham, N.C., the Zoo Society and the Zoo introduced a new interactive compact disc in 2004 highlighting the Zoo's conservation, education, research and recreation missions. The CD employs the highest interactive technology to provide an exceptional multimedia introduction to the Zoo. Viewers can explore the Zoo's exhibits, wildlife rehabilitation program, red wolf release program, and much more. Copies of the CD are now on sale at Zoo Society gift shops, and media copies are available upon request.

The MindWorks contribution, valued at \$75,000 over three years, demonstrates the exceptional impact that corporate members and donors can have with non-cash contributions.

In all, in-kind and cash support from North Carolina businesses

boosted the Society Corporate Membership program by 41 percent in 2004 to \$152,000. Six new organizations joined the program in 2004.

## **Zoo Veterinary Residency Program**

The Zoo Society provided \$45,000 in 2004 to support the veterinary residency in zoological medicine that the Zoo coordinates with the N.C. State University College of Veterinary Medicine. This joint program provides students with a world-renowned 3-year residency focused on animals living in zoos and in the

wild. It is one of fewer than a dozen programs in the United States that directly engages veterinary residents with exotic (non-domestic) animals and has trained nearly 10 percent of the veterinarians worldwide who hold board certification in the specialty of zoological medicine.

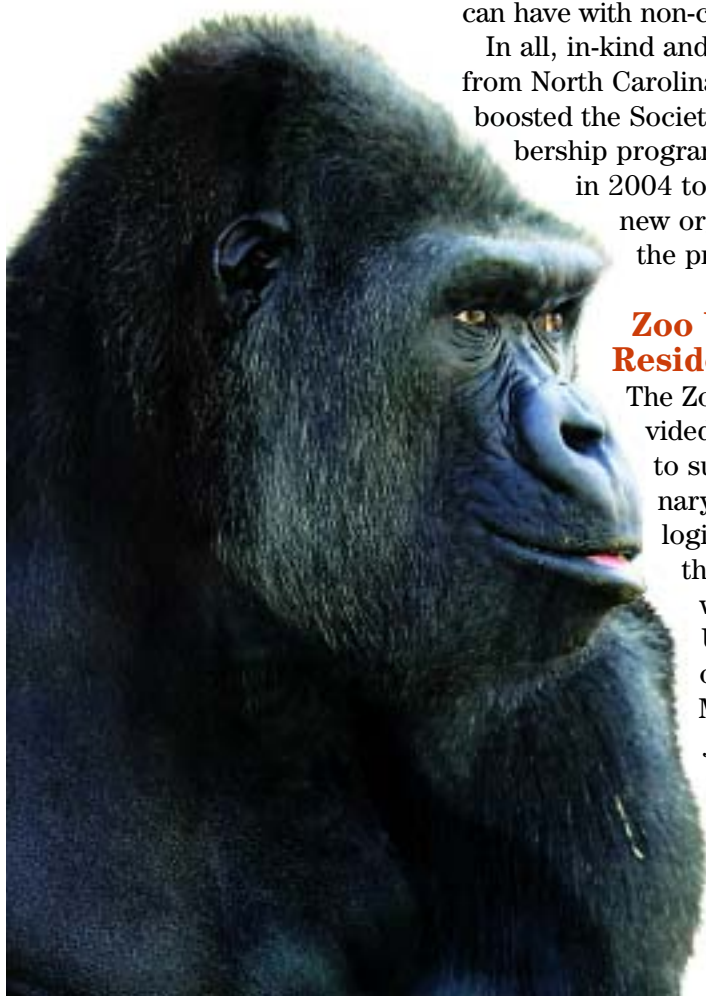
## **Art**

Art as a "sensory bridge" to the natural world continues to be a priority of both the Zoo and the Zoo Society. In 2004, the Zoo Society and its members provided significant support to art and design at the Zoo. Of particular note, the Zoo Society, through a donation by Bob and Bonnie Meeker, provided \$75,000 for a new sculpture to be placed near the Prairie viewing area. The abstract sculpture, by artist Pete Beeman, will invite visitors to explore interactions between energy and mechanics and learn about renewable resources.

## **Conservation Education**

In 2004, the North Carolina Science Teachers Association (NCSTA) presented the Zoo Society's Online Learning Coordinator, Mark MacAllister, with its annual award of distinction for individuals working in non-school settings who provide exceptional service to science education in North Carolina. The NCSTA honored MacAllister for his work with wildlife researchers, teachers and K-12 students through the Zoo Society's Web site, [fieldtripearth.com](http://fieldtripearth.com).

The Field Trip Earth Web site lets educators and students interact with ongoing field-based wildlife conservation scientists. In November 2004, the Elementary Science Program of the Monroe 2-Orleans Board of Cooperative Educational Services, which represents about 200 school districts in New York, selected Field Trip Earth as its Animal Site of the Month.





## FOCUS ON: *Outdoor Fun*

### **Holiday Fun**

During the last three weeks of October, Zoo visitors encountered spooky fun on the Zoo's after-hours haunted tram ride, "Nightmare on Purgatory Mountain." Underwritten



### **Zoo To Do**

Generously sponsored by Randolph Telephone and held in September, *Zoo To Do* 2004 generated nearly \$186,000. The bulk of this funding will be combined with funds from

previous *Zoo To Dos* to support *Project: Pachyderms*. The Randolph Friends of the Zoo, a volunteer board of civic leaders who coordinate *Zoo To Do*, has pledged \$2 million from *Zoo To Do* earnings to become the overall sponsor of the *Watani Grasslands* exhibit that *Project: Pachyderms* will help create. A small portion (\$7,500) of the money raised at *Zoo To Do* 2004 to supports a special Randolph Friends of the Zoo fund that awards small grants to Zoo and Society employees who use them to advance the Zoo's conservation, education, research or recreation missions.



by the Zoo Society, the event (named in memory of the eerie fires of whiskey stills rumored to have operated on nearby Purgatory Mountain during Prohibition) offers fun for Zoo visitors of all ages with storytelling, wizards, the spooky graveyard, the haunted tram ride and a haunted walk through a section of the Zoo. Attractions in 2004 included a 12-foot-tall, fire-breathing dragon.

The Zoo Society also underwrote the Zoo's annual Holiday of Lights display in 2004 from November 26 through January 2. Visitors enjoyed a spectacular display of lights over a two-mile drive at the Zoo. The event was a success largely due to support from Randolph Electric Membership Corporation and BB&T.

### **For Members Only**

The Zoo Society was happy to thank its members for their continued support in 2004 by holding two members-only events, *Wake Up With the Animals* and *Sunset With the Animals*. During these annual events, members gather at the Park outside normal operating hours for entertainment, refreshments, and to socialize with others who share their commitment to the Zoo and its missions.

Zoo Society members also enjoyed Super Society Saturday programs such as Native Animals of North Carolina, Piedmont Prairie Ecology and an evening hike through the Zoo called "Hoot 'N Howl."

# ZOOM OUT



## FOCUS ON: *North Carolina*

### **Sylvan Heights**

With more than 2,500 birds representing 170 species, Sylvan Heights Waterfowl Center in Scotland Neck, N.C., is home to the largest captive



waterfowl population in North America. Sylvan Heights Director, Mike Lubbock, has achieved 17 World and 12 North American First Breeding Awards—an accomplishment unsurpassed by any other person. Sylvan Heights trains interns, volunteers, young people, and future curators from around the world and collaborates with academic and wildlife organizations in research, field expeditions and conservation.

The Zoo Society has partnered with Sylvan Heights to design and begin creating a world-class eco-tourism facility with aviaries representative of the Americas,



Europe, Africa, and Australia; lake-side stations for viewing migrating swans and geese; a state-of-the-art outdoor avian theater; a collection of avian artwork; and the Center for Advanced Avian Studies with a library, conference room, office, laboratory, lounge and kitchen. This Center will become a hub for programs and projects to preserve endangered waterfowl around the world.

At the end of 2004, the Zoo Society had raised \$400,000 of \$1.5 million needed for Sylvan Heights. An anonymous donor gave \$280,000. Golden LEAF, Inc. provided \$50,000, Steinhardt Management Company provided \$10,000, and two couples, Len and Joyce Tufts and Peter and Ona Pickens, each provided \$5,000.

### **Valerie H. Schindler Wildlife Rehabilitation Center**

In 2004, the Zoo Society provided \$55,628 to support the Valerie H. Schindler Wildlife Rehabilitation Center. The Center offers free veterinary and rehabilitation services to orphaned and injured native North Carolina animals. Zoo Society funds provided medicine, food, veterinary and rehabilitative services for the almost 1,000 animals referred to the Center in 2004. Society funding also supported the Center's educational programs to teach children, civic groups and others how to live more compatibly with North Carolina wildlife. These programs touched more than 2,000 North Carolina school children in 2004.



## FOCUS ON: *The World*

### **Wildlife Collaboration**

The Zoo Society continued its commitment to support the Zoo's



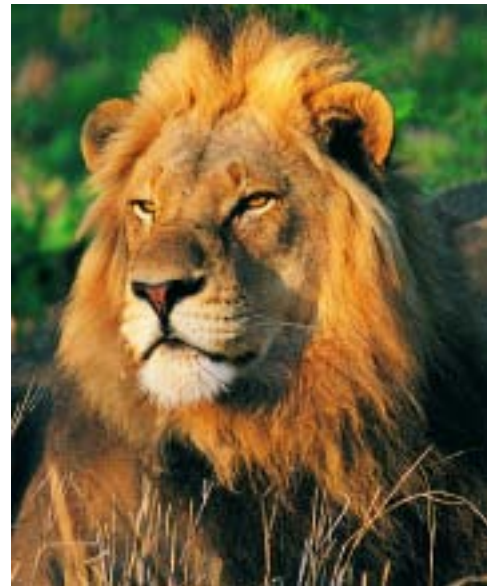
ongoing conservation programs around the world in 2004. Through contributions from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the International Elephant Foundation, the Society provided more than \$65,000 to the Elephants of Cameroon project. This project, a joint effort between the Zoo, World Wildlife Fund-Cameroon (WWF), and the Cameroon Ministry of Environment and Forests, uses satellite and radio tracking to identify the migration routes of endangered African elephants.

Zoo Chief Veterinarian, Dr. Mike Loomis, in collaboration with WWF-Cameroon and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service,

used the tracking data to reduce conflicts between the elephants and the growing populations of people on the farms and in the villages of Cameroon.

### **U.N.I.T.E.**

Uganda and North Carolina International Teaching for the Environment (U.N.I.T.E.) is a Zoo project to bring Ugandan and North Carolina schools together to advance conservation education through teacher-exchanges. Zoo Society donations provide significant support to the program. In 2004, U.N.I.T.E. sent six North Carolina teachers to Uganda.



### **Kabul and Baghdad**

In March, 2004, the Zoo Society hosted a public dedication ceremony at the N.C. Zoo for a bronze sculpture of Marjan, the African lion who once lived in the Kabul Zoo in Afghanistan. The sculpture, created and donated by Texas artist Bob Coffee, depicts Marjan who, blinded and battered by the Taliban, came to symbolize the suffering of war.

Two and a half years after the N.C. Zoo became involved, nearly half the Kabul Zoo's major structures have been restored and in most cases improved and enlarged. One hundred trees have been planted, irrigation systems are in place, animal facilities are being kept clean and animals are receiving fresh water and healthy diets. In addition, a monkey island has been completed and benches have been installed in the park area.

For the future, the focus is on helping the Kabul Zoo become self sufficient.

This will be a challenge, but the N.C. Zoo and Zoo Society are committed to supporting the Kabul Zoo in this effort. In 2004, the N.C. Zoo Society provided \$179,145 to the Kabul Zoo and transferred another \$15,000 to the Afghan Animal Fund.

The Zoo and Zoo Society continue to support the Baghdad Zoo in Iraq with both funds and expertise. Most of the assistance in 2004 focused on animal needs and training for staff.

## FOCUS ON: *The Future*

In a web-based competition sponsored by Microsoft Games Studio in 2004, the North Carolina Zoo was voted one of the top five zoos in the United States. The N.C. Zoo Society is confident that with initiatives like *Project: Pachyderms* and Field Trip Earth, the reputation and outreach of the N.C. Zoo will continue to grow in the years ahead.

Zoo Society members and donors played a key role in making the N.C. Zoo one of the finest in the country, and they will be a vital part of the exciting times ahead. We are grateful for the trust and generosity of our members and donors. Future generations of children, scientists, conservationists, and many others around the world will also be grateful.

With this in mind, the Zoo Society closes 2004 focused on our goal of "Saving a Piece of the World for Its

Wildlife." We will do this by maintaining our high standard of careful, responsible stewardship of funds entrusted to us by members and donors. This sense of stewardship responsibility permeates the Zoo Society's professional staff. As evidence, Society Executive Director, Russ Williams, was honored in 2004 as Professional Fundraiser of the Year by the North Carolina Triad Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP). The AFP noted that "Russ...helps promote the ethical advancement of the profession by his honorable example."

With leadership and a renewed commitment to provide the kind of responsive, thorough service that members and donors expect, the Zoo Society's and the Zoo's future look bright indeed.

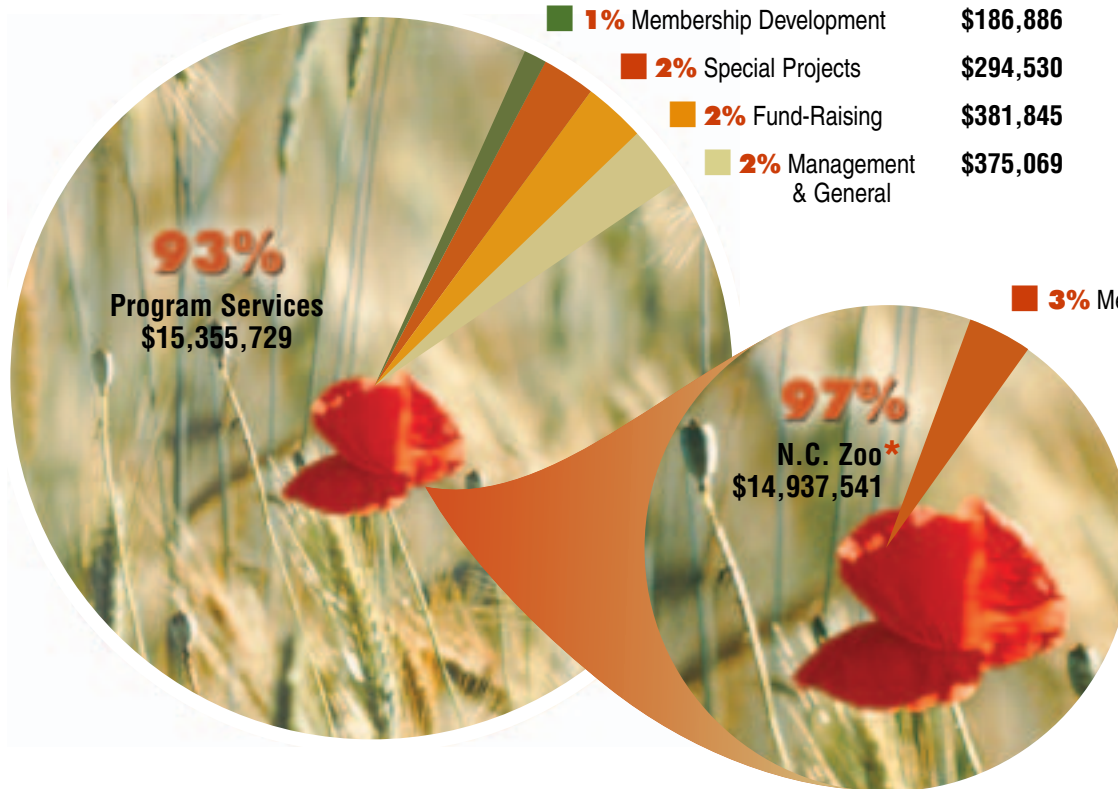

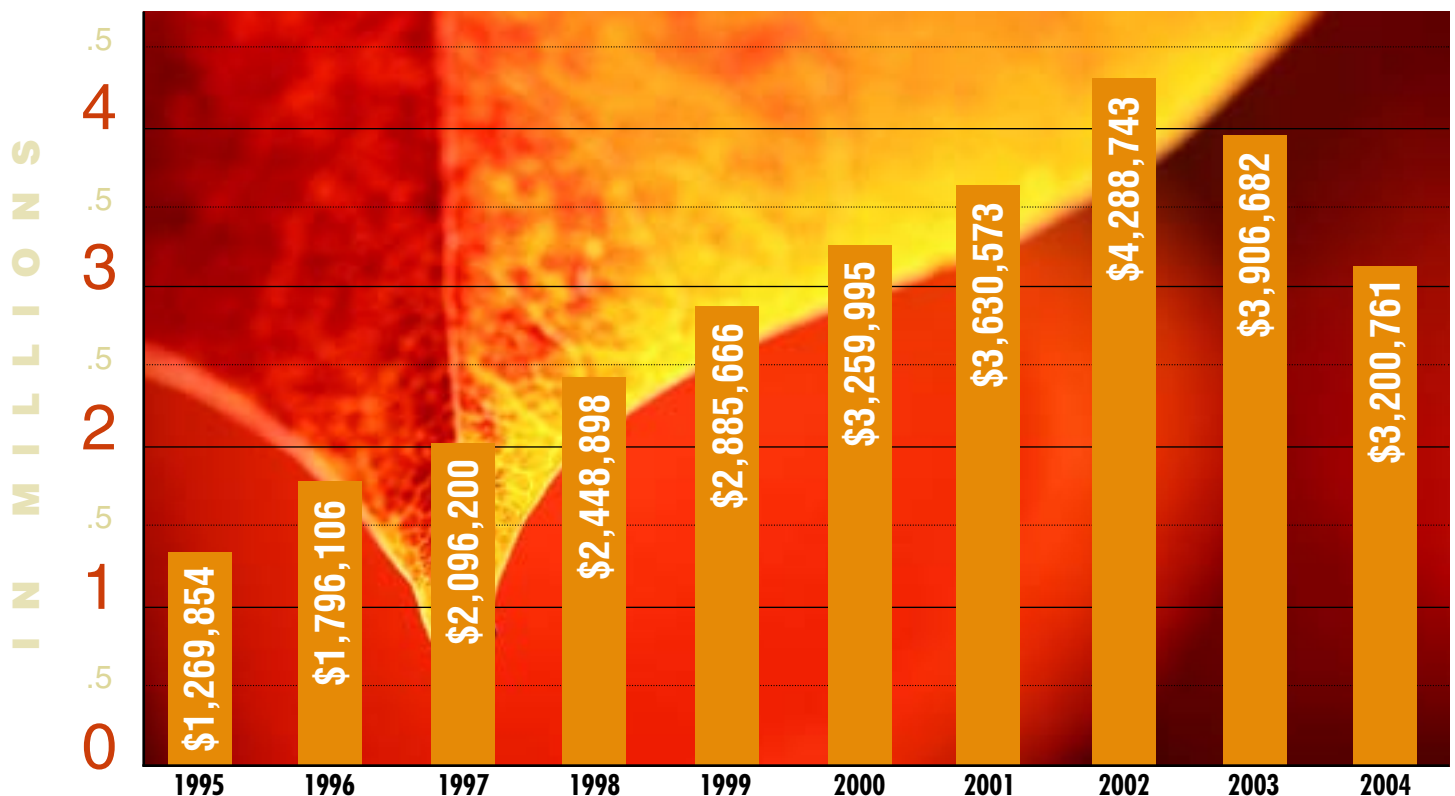
## Use of Funds
