We have audited the accompanying statements of financial position of The North Carolina Zoological Society, Inc. (a nonprofit organization) as of December 31, 2008 and 2007, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the years then ended. Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2008 and 2007

Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies

Nature of activities

The North Carolina Zoological Society, Inc. (the Society) encourages public support primarily for the North Carolina Zoological Park, a state operated facility, and promotes related educational, scientific and conservation activities. The Society also solicits public support for the Sylvan Heights Waterfowl Park and Eco-Center. The Society is supported primarily through memberships and donor contributions.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Society have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and, accordingly, reflect all significant receivables, payables, and other liabilities.

Basis of presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, Financial Statements for Not-For-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No. 117, the Society is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the prior year financial statements have been reclassified for comparative purposes to conform with presentation in the current year financial statements.

Promises to give

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to the Society that is, in substance, unconditional. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets.

The Society uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible unconditional promises receivable. The allowance is based on prior years' experience and management's analysis of specific promises to give.

The Society funded the creation of the Sylvan Heights Waterfowl Park and Eco-Center and made a conditional promise to donate the land, building, and exhibits. The donation originally was dependent upon Sylvan Heights obtaining its not-for-profit status. During 2007, Sylvan Heights Waterfowl Park and Eco-Center's application for 501(c)(3) status was approved by the IRS and the applicable items were donated.

Temporarily restricted contributions - grants

Temporarily restricted contributions include a number of grants in addition to donor-restricted contributions. These grants totaled \$726,754 and \$578,486 during the years ended 2008 and 2007, respectively.

In-kind donated materials, services and facilities

Donated materials, specialized services and facilities received by the Society are reflected as both contributions and expenses in the accompanying statements at their estimated fair market value at the time of receipt.

In-kind donated materials, services and facilities, continued

The North Carolina Zoological Park provides office and gift shop facilities for the Society at no charge. For the years ended December 31, 2008 and 2007, in-kind support in the amount of \$31,016 and \$0 was recognized in the Statements of Activities for the use of these facilities, respectively.

Cash and cash equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Society considers all highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Investments

The Society carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statement of activities.

Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost or market determined by the first-in, first-out method. Inventories consist of items available for sale in the Society's gift shops.

Property and equipment

Property and equipment is carried at cost or, if donated, at the approximate fair market value at the date of donation. The Society capitalizes all property and equipment items costing over \$500. Depreciation is computed using primarily the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Income taxes

The Society is a not-for-profit organization other than a private foundation that is exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Society received a tax determination letter dated March 30, 1971. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not include a provision for income taxes.

FASB Staff Position (FSP) 48-3 defers the effective date of FASB Interpretation No. 48 (FIN 48), *Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes*, for certain non-public enterprises for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2008. The Society has elected to defer the application of FIN 48 in accordance with FSP 48-3. During the deferral period of the application of FIN 48 the Society will continue to evaluate uncertain tax positions utilizing the underlying principals of FAS 109, *Accounting for Income Taxes*, and FAS 5, *Accounting for Contingencies*.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies, continued

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates. Significant estimates and assumptions are used for, but not limited to the allowance for uncollectible contributions, discount to net present value for pledges receivable, depreciable lives of fixed assets, and value for in-kind donated materials and services. The value for in-kind donated materials and services is considered a significant revenue that require management estimates and is summarized in Note 11. The other estimates did not have a significant impact on the current year financial statements.

Note 2 - Deposits

The Society places its cash and cash equivalents on deposit with financial institutions in the United States. In October and November 2008 the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) temporarily increased coverage to \$250,000 for substantially all depository accounts and temporarily provides unlimited coverage for certain qualifying and participating non-interest bearing transaction accounts. The increased coverage is scheduled to expire on December 31, 2009, at which time it is anticipated amounts insured by the FDIC will return to \$100,000. During the year, the Society from time to time may have had amounts on deposit in excess of the insured limits. As of December 31, 2008, the Society had \$533,391 which exceeds these insured amounts.

The Society's endowments are held in several accounts with two financial institutions. The endowments have different requirements regarding the appreciation of long-term investments, depending on donor stipulations or state law. At December 31, 2008, the fair value of invested assets assigned to the permanently restricted endowment net asset balance required to be maintained in perpetuity had a \$36,656 deficiency. Pledges receivable that are due beyond one year are discounted to their estimated net present value. The discount rate is based on a rate of return for risk-free investments covering a similar period of time. The discount rates vary depending on when the pledge originates and are as follows:

Note 5 – Charitable remainder trust

During 1997, a donor established a trust naming the Society as the sole beneficiary of a charitable remainder trust. A charitable remainder trust provides for the payment of distributions to the grantor over the trust's term. At the end of the trust's term, the remaining assets will be distributed for the Society's use. This trust has a term of twenty years and the donor serves as trustee. A portion of the trust attributed to the present value of the future benefits to be received by the Society is recorded in the statement of activities as a temporarily restricted contribution and in the statement of financial position as a contribution receivable from the charitable remainder trust. The present value of the estimated future payment in twenty years was calculated using a discount rate of seven percent. The Society has recognized \$27,102 as its interest in the unitrust through December 31, 2008.

The Society administers, as trustee, a charitable remainder trust established during 2004. The charitable remainder trust provides for the payment of distributions to the grantor over the donor's life expectancy, which is the trust's term. At the end of the trust's term, the remaining assets are available for the Society's use. The portion of the trust attributable to the present value of the future benefits to be received by the Society is recorded in the Statement of Activities as a temporarily restricted contribution in the period that the trust is established. There were no contributions in 2008 and 2007. Assets held in the charitable remainder trust totaled \$589,014 and \$952,066 at December 31, 2008 and 2007 and are reported at fair market value in the Society's Statement of Financial Position. On an annual basis, the Society revalues the liability to make distributions to the designated beneficiaries based on actuarial assumptions. The agreement provides for distributions to the grantors of an amount equal to 8% of the net fair market value of the Trust assets valued at the beginning of each taxable year. The present value of the estimated future payments (\$491,239 and \$802,132 at December 31, 2008 and 2007) is calculated using a discount rate of 5% and applicable mortality tables.

The Society was notified in 2006 that during 1992, a donor established a trust naming the Society as a partial beneficiary of a charitable remainder trust. A charitable remainder trust provides for the payment of distributions to the grantor over the donor's life expectancy, which is the trust's term. At the end of the trust's term, the remaining assets will be distributed for the Society's use. A portion of the trust attributed to the present value of the future benefits to be received by the Society is recorded in the statement of activities as a temporarily restricted contribution and in the statement of financial position as a contribution receivable from the charitable remainder trust. The present value of the estimated future payment was calculated using a discount rate of 5%. The Society has recognized \$16,978 as its interest in the unitrust through December 31, 2008.

Note 13 – Retirement plan

The Society participates in a defined contribution plan administered by Mutual of America. All employees are eligible to participate after one year of service, after which the Society contributes 9% of participating employees' annual salary. Vesting of employees' benefits under the plan occurs after three years. The cost of the plan for 2008 and 2007 was \$109,356 and \$99,576, respectively.

Note 14 - Related party transactions

In October 2002, the Society's board of directors agreed to fund \$250,000 to the NC Zoological Park for marketing and promotion expenses. The Board thought of this supplement as a 0% interest-revolving fund controlled by the Park. In October 2003, the Society's board of directors agreed to grant an additional \$250,000 marketing supplement to the Park. As of December 31, 2008, \$487,638 had been transferred to the Park for the supplemental marketing fund.

The Society is a trustee for a charitable remainder trust, as summarized in Note 5, which was donated by a member of the Board of Directors.

The Society maintains bank deposits and investments with an institution totaling \$330,310 as of December 31, 2008 where two members of the Board of Directors serve in a management position. There were no investment fees paid to this institution during 2008.

Included in pledges receivable as of December 31, 2008 is \$215,892 due from various related parties.
